The Garden Study Club Exhibit Rules

General Rules for Exhibitors

- 1. Exhibits must be in place no later than 12:15 p.m. in order to be judged. Late arrivals will receive ONE credit point for participation.
- 2. Exhibits which do not conform to the schedule will not be judged but will receive ONE credit point for participation.
- 3. Exhibitor cards will be available at 12 noon and must accompany entries.
- 4. Points will be determined by the judge and a member of the Exhibits Committee.
- 5. ONLY ONE artistic exhibit and ONE horticulture specimen may be entered each meeting for credit points.
- 6. ALL MEMBERS ARE **REQUIRED** TO EXHIBIT AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR! (ONE artistic and ONE horticulture exhibit)
- 7. A credit of 10 points will be given to each member entering an INDIVIDUAL artistic arrangement or a horticulture specimen in the GCV Flower Shows. A member must notify the Exhibits Chairman of her participation in the show. (9/11)
- 8. A credit of 6 points will be given to each member for her participation in Special Projects. The chairmen of the special project must notify the Exhibits Chairmen with a list of members who participated.
- 9. Points WILL NOT be given for participation in Historic Garden Week or the GCV Flower Show Interclub arrangement since EVERY Member is EXPECTED to participate in these projects.

Rules for Artistic Design Exhibitors

- 1. Accessories and background are permitted unless prohibited in the schedule. A base or stand is considered part of the container.
- 2. Exhibitors are encouraged to include a 3" x 5" card listing plant material used.
- 3. Credit points for artistic design: blue-10, red-8, yellow-7, white-6, participation-5

- 4. Artistic arrangements will be judged on the following: color combination, design, originality, relation to container, condition of materials.
- 5. The following are to be observed when creating artistic exhibits:

**Line – A visual path that leads the eye through the design and establishes the structural framework of the design. It carries the rhythm through the design. **Miniature Design – A design measuring no more than five inches in any dimension.

All principles apply but scale is the most important.

**Statement of Intent – A brief explanation by the exhibitor of the message the exhibit is intended to convey, or of the symbolic meaning of any component(s).

**Card of Intent – States the arranger's inspiration and personal expression of the class schedule.

The Garden Study Club Exhibit Rules

**Challenge Class – A class in flower shows where the flower show committee supplies all components. These items should be as identical as possible for each exhibitor.

**Pot-Et-Fleur – A combination of two or more rooted plants growing in soil artistically arranged with cut plant material in one basket or other suitable container. **Oriental Design – The art of Japanese flower arranging is known as "Ikebana." There is great symbolism in the choice and combination of the plant material. In Japan, these designs are admired for their beauty as a work of art and are never judged. Our flower show schedules may include an *adaptation* of these designs and ask for designs "Showing Japanese Influence" or "In the Oriental Manner." **Accessories – *The GCV Flower Shows Handbook* permits accessories unless prohibited by the schedule.

Rules for Horticulture Exhibitors

- 1. Exhibits with disease, obvious defects or abnormalities will not be judged.
- 2. Botanical and common name must be listed on exhibitor card.
- 3. Exhibits to be displayed in a clear glass or acrylic container.
- 4. A collection consists of a minimum of three different cultivars, staged in separate containers.
- 5. Credit points for horticulture: blue-6, red-4, yellow-3, white-2, participation-1.
- 6. Specimens will be judged on the following:
 - condition, stem, foliage and size according to variety.
- 7. Specific specimens for each month are listed on the schedule.
- 8. No points will be awarded unless exhibitor exhibits material on the monthly list.
- 9. Exhibitors MUST conform to the schedule.

Rules of Creative Horticluture (ex: Assembled Garden)

1. Credit points for creative horticulture: blue-8, red-6, yellow-4, white-2, participation-1.

- 2. Exhibitor followed schedule for design.
- 3. Proportion of plant materials to container.
- 4. All plant material identified on exhibit card.

Garden Study Club Exhibit Teams 2022-2024

Teams will compete by exhibiting arrangements and horticulture specimens at each meeting. Co-captains of each team are marked with an asterisk(*). (1) They will share the responsibility for motivating their teammates to bring exhibits to each monthly meeting. (2) They will encourage team members to use the "GCV Handbook of Floral Styles and Designs" and other resources. (3) They will organize the team in constructing the "Team Arrangement" for the October and March meetings. (4) They will coordinate and execute the assigned interclub flower arrangements for the Garden Club of Virginia flower shows and also ensure the club is registered for these flower shows.

Teams will be in place for 2 years. Co-captains will remain the same for 2 years. Awards and prizes will be given every two years for team competition. New members will be added to keep the teams even in number.

The Katherine Hild Turner Horticulture Trophy

Guidelines for Admissions And Proposals of New Members

- I. Garden Study Club Admissions Procedures

 - 4. The candidate should not be asked directly the questions as outlined on the Guidelines For Proposal of New Members, but information obtained in a discrete way.
 - 5. The Admissions Chairman is responsible for preparing the ballot.
 - 6. The Corresponding Secretary will write the invitation to the new member.
 - 7. The Admissions Chairman and Committee, Executive Board and persons submitting the proposal should be notified by the Corresponding Secretary as soon as she has received a response from the new member.
- II. Mentoring Guidelines
 - 1. The persons signing a membership proposal shall serve as mentors to the new member for one year.
 - 2. They should:
 - Provide the new member with a clear vase for exhibiting horticulture.
 - Offer to pick up the new member and bring to the meeting.
 - Make sure that the new member receives a yearbook.
 - Go over the yearbook with the new member.
 - Explain the artistic and horticulture exhibits displayed at each meeting.
 - Explain the criteria for the following awards: The Sallie Mason Clark Trophy, The Katherine Hild Turner Horticulture Trophy, The Kitty Sparrow Activity Trophy, Virginia Hodnett Spirit Award (Review the green worksheet in Yearbook)
 - Explain the Exhibit Teams guidelines.
 - Explain the hostess schedule and responsibilities.
 - Explain the requirements regarding attending meetings and paying dues.
 - Review assigned committee responsibilities.
 - Review requirements for Historic Garden Week to include the duties of their committee assignment and responsibilities.

The Garden Study Club Standing Rules and Policies

The Executive Board has approved the following Standing Rules and Policies Approved September 2005 - Revised 10/07, 02/09, 03/10, 9/14, 09/15, 02/17, 09/19, 8/22

- I. Garden Study Club Policies and Procedures:
 - 1. The club annually pays for: one daffodil collection, one lily collection and one rose collection. These collections are to be planted by the respective chairman. The Club Flower Collection Chairmen are encouraged to exhibit from the Club's collection in the GCV Flower Shows.
 - 2. The club requires each member to sell the designated number of tickets as directed by the local Garden Week Chair. (09/15) Members admitted to the club after the March meeting will not be required to sell tickets for Historic Garden Week. (03/07)
 - 3. The budget for the Program Committee is \$300.00 annually. A \$25.00 honorarium will be sent to the Kent-Valentine House when a GCV member presents the club's program. (09/87)
 - 4. A \$25.00 memorial will be given to GCV in memory of a deceased Garden Study Member. (04/88)
 - 5. A \$25.00 donation will be made to the Patrick Henry Rose Society when the society hosts a show. (9/19)

5a. A gift or honorarium of no more than 25.00 will be presented to a guest judge or guest arranger. Team/Exhibit chair is responsible for this. (02/17)

- 6. A \$100 donation will be made annually to the GCV Endowment Fund. (02/09)
- 7. All non-budgeted projects must be approved by the Board and presented to the membership before the project is begun. All expense receipts must be presented to the Treasurer in a timely fashion before payment can be received. (04/97)
- 8. The club has hostesses for each meeting. The first named individual is head hostess for the monthly meeting. Responsibilities include: (8/22)tyfdf
 - a. Selecting menu, price not to exceed approved amount per person, and give number of attendees to caterer or club in advance.
 - b. Coordinate with other hostesses to invite all active and sustaining members.
 - c. Notify Treasurer of any member who fails to honor a lunch reservation. (09/19)
- 9. If the club finds it necessary to cancel a meeting due to inclement weather the following policy will be followed.
 - a. The meeting will not count against the four (4) required meetings if the club member had responded to the head hostess to attend the meeting. (8/22)

Those who attend are responsible for making a report to the club at the next business meeting or in the newsletter. (11/95) (09/15)
 - 4. The GCV State Horticulture Committee holds a Horticulture Field Day and workshop annually. These meetings are to be attended by the President or her designee and the Horticulture Chairman or her designee. The club will pay the registration fees and travel expenses (gas* and food) and room (09/14) for the Club's two representatives. Those who attend are responsible for making a report to the club at the next business meeting or in the newsletter. (09/15)
 - 5. When representing the Garden Study Club at GCV events, members are asked to please be considerate when spending the Garden Study Club's resources. (9/14)

- 3. A contribution will be made annually to the GCV Flower Show Committee to help defray expenses of the Member Club Cup and the President's Cup, which is given at each GCV Show. (September 20, 1983)
- 4. Any Garden Study Club member winning a colored ribbon in a GCV sponsored flower show will be given team credit.
- 5. Any Garden Study Club member attending a GCV sponsored meeting which conflicts with our regular meeting day may count this meeting as one of her required four meetings.
- IV. Joint Meeting with the Martinsville Garden Club (09/14)

Every two years a new State President is elected. It is her policy to visit each of the clubs in the state. In the past Garden Study Club and Martinsville Garden Club rotated hosting the President at a joint meeting in January and the next year the other club would host a joint program.

Over the years this has not taken place as a rotation. To that end Sue Rosser and Gail Mitchell agreed that beginning in January 2015 Martinsville Garden Club would host the new President at the January joint meeting and the next year 2016 Martinsville Garden Club would also host the joint meeting providing a program. This way the rotation schedule would be maintained.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE GARDEN STUDY CLUB

Revised May 2008, May 2010, March 2011, January 2013, April 2014, October 2014, November 2015, February 2018, May 2018, September 2019, September 2022

CONSTITUTION

Article I Name

The organization shall be called The Garden Study Club.

Article II Purpose

The purpose of the club shall be to promote interest and knowledge of gardening; to stimulate interest in civic beautification and conservation (to aid in the protection of birds, trees, shrubs, and wildflowers); and to aid in projects with The Garden Club of Virginia of which this club is a member. (09/19)

Article III Meetings

Unless otherwise specified by the Executive Committee, the regular meeting of the club shall be at 12:30 p.m. on the third Tuesday of each month. There will be no regular meeting in June, July, August and December. (09/19)

Article IV Membership

- Section 1: The active membership shall not exceed 60. Associates Membership shall not exceed 5. A vacancy shall occur in the active membership upon a member's resignation from the club or death, or upon a member's change in status from active to non-resident or sustainer. (3/11)
- Section 2: The dues paying membership shall consist of Active, Associates, Non-Resident and Sustaining members.

Article V Officers

The officers of the club shall consist of a President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and Parliamentarian. If the office of Second Vice-President cannot be filled, the club may operate without a Second Vice-President, only as a last resort. (02/18)

Article VI Executive Committee

There shall be an Executive Committee composed of the officers of the club, the immediate Past-President, the Historic Garden Week Chairman, and the Admissions Chairman.

Article VII Amendments

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended or revised by 2/3 vote of the members present at any regular meeting, provided the proposed amendment has been presented to the membership at a previous meeting.

BY-LAWS

Article I Meetings

- Section 1: There shall be two business meetings per year, one in October and one in March. (5/07) No guests will be allowed at these meetings.
- Section 2: A simple majority of the active members present shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
- Section 3: <u>Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised</u> shall be the parliamentary authority for The Garden Study Club.

Article II Membership

- Section 1: Active members shall be those who attend the regular meetings and participate in activities of the club.
- Section 1a: Active members shall be required to attend at least four regular meetings per year.
- Section 1b: If at the end of the current year, May 31, there are members who have not attended four regular meetings, such members will be dropped from the roll, thus creating a vacancy in membership.
- Section 1c: A member not able to fulfill her meeting requirements because of extenuating circumstances may appeal to the Executive Committee in writing before May 31 for special consideration.
- Section 2: Associate members shall be those Active members who have been given a leave of absence by the Executive Committee.
- Section 2a: Any member in good standing may request a leave of absence not to exceed two years. During leave, the member may attend meetings, but have no vote, hold no office, and cannot nominate or endorse names for membership.

- Section 2b: An associate member desiring to be reinstated to Active membership shall notify the Executive Committee. After two years, an Associate member shall either return to Active membership or resign.
- Section 2c: Associate membership shall be limited to five at any given time. (09/19).
- Section 2d: Associate members shall be required to pay dues.
- Section 3: Non-resident members shall be those Active members who have moved from the area but are interested in retaining affiliation with The Garden Study Club and in furthering its objectives. They shall not vote, hold office, and cannot nominate or endorse names for membership.
- Section 3a: Non-resident members shall be required to pay dues.
- Section 3b: Upon their return to the area, Non-resident members may be reinstated to Active Membership by notifying the Executive Committee in writing.
- Section 4: Sustaining members may be those who have been Active members for twenty-five years, and wish to become inactive. They shall apply in writing to the Executive Committee for such status. They may enjoy all the privileges of the club with two exceptions: they shall not hold office, and they shall not vote.
- Section 4a: Sustaining members shall be required to pay dues.
- Section 5: Honorary members shall be those the club wishes to honor for outstanding service or individuals deserving special recognition.
- Section 5a: Honorary members may attend meetings but hold no office, may not vote, and may not propose or endorse names for membership.
- Section 5b: Honorary members shall not be required to pay dues. (09/19)
- Section 6: Members wishing to resign from the club in good standing shall submit a resignation in writing to the Executive Committee and pay dues for the current fiscal year.

Article III Admissions (3/11, 1/13, 4/14, 10/14)

- Section 1: Active members may be elected as vacancies occur and those vacancies will be announced at any monthly meeting.
- Section 1a: The names of the candidates must be presented to the chairman of the Admissions Committee one week before the monthly meeting using the membership questionnaire provided in the yearbook as a guide. The candidate must be proposed by one member and seconded by another.
- Section 1b: The proposal should be typed and delivered or emailed to the Admissions Chairman or a member of the Admissions Committee one week prior to the monthly meeting.
- Section 1c: The Admissions Committee shall determine if the candidate proposed will be an asset to The Garden Study Club.
- Section 1d: Each proposal for membership will be voted on by secret ballot as presented at the monthly meeting.
- Section 1e: To be elected to membership, the candidate must receive a majority vote of the written proxies and the Active members present.
- Section 1f: Written proxies may be submitted to the chairman of the Admissions Committee prior to the monthly meeting.
- Section 1g: The ballots shall be counted at the meeting by the Admissions Committee and membership notified of the results at the meeting.
- Section 1h: Names of eligible candidates not receiving majority vote for membership may be presented again when subsequent vacancies occur.
- Section 1i: If a former member, who has resigned in good standing, desires to become a member again, she should write a letter to the board requesting readmission.
 If there is a vacancy, the board will vote on the request for reinstatement. If there is no vacancy at the time, the board will vote on readmission when a vacancy occurs.
 The reinstatement will take place on notification to the newly reinstated member. (10/14)

Article IV Election of Officers

- Section 1: The slate of officers shall be presented in February, elected at the March business meeting and installed at the May meeting.
- Section 1a: A nominating committee shall nominate the officers to fill the official positions for two years. If there are nominations other than those presented by the committee, the voting shall be by secret ballot.
- Section 1b: To be elected, the nominees for office must receive a simple majority of votes of members present.
- Section 1c: No officer is eligible to succeed herself, except the offices of Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary, who may serve a second successive term if she so chooses. (11/15), (05/18)

Article V Duties of Officers

- Section 1: The President shall preside at all meetings of the club. She shall appoint all standing committee chairman and committee members and other special committees as necessary. She shall present a yearly report of the work of the club at the March business meeting. The President shall represent The Garden Study Club at the meeting of the Board of Governor's in the fall and the Annual Meeting in the spring. She shall appoint the First Vice-President as the club's delegate.
- Section 2: The First Vice-President shall assume the office of President in her absence. She shall attend the Annual meeting of The Garden Club of Virginia as the club's delegate. She shall serve as chairman of the Ways and Means Committee. (5/08) (5/10)
- Section 3: The Second Vice-President shall serve as chairman of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. (5/08) (5/10) (9/16)
- Section 4: The Recording Secretary shall keep the minutes of the Executive Committee and regular club meetings in permanent form. At each meeting, she will provide the minutes of the previous meeting. (9/22)
- Section 5: The Corresponding Secretary shall have charge of the general correspondence of the club and shall notify those candidates elected to membership. She shall keep an accurate record of club attendance and take the roll at each meeting. She shall notify all members in writing who have not attended the required number of meetings by January 31 and shall report this action to the club membership at the February meeting. She shall notify in writing anyone whose name has been dropped from the roll and report this action to the club membership. She shall also notify all Associate members who have reached the end of their two year leave.

- Section 6: The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all funds of the club. She shall notify all members of unpaid dues by the January meeting, submit an annual report to the President by the March business meeting, serve as chairman of the Finance Committee and serve on the Hospitality Committee. (5/10)
- Section 7: The Parliamentarian shall serve as a member of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. She shall maintain order at all meetings and familiarize herself with Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised.

Article VI Dues

- Section 1: The fiscal year shall be from June 1 to May 31.
- Section 2: Members must pay dues of current fiscal year to remain in good standing. Dues shall be waived until September for members admitted after the March meeting. (5/07)
- Section 3: Annual dues for Active members shall be \$115.00, payable on July 1. (3/08) (5/10) (3/22) (8/22)
- Section 4: Annual dues for Sustaining members shall be \$115.00, payable on July 1. (5/10) (3/22) (8/22)
- Section 5: Annual dues for Associate members shall be \$115.00, payable on July 1. (5/10) (3/22) (8/22)
- Section 6: Annual dues for Non-Resident members shall be \$115.00, payable on July 1. (5/10) (3/22) (8/22)
- Section 7: There shall be a fine of \$5.00 each month for all dues not current by the November meeting. If dues are not paid by May 31, the member shall be dropped from membership. (5/10)

Article VII Executive Committee

- Section 1: The Executive Committee shall meet at the call of the President to prepare the business for the regular club meeting.
- Section 2: The Executive Committee shall be empowered to transact all necessary business between regular meetings of the club.
- Section 3: The Executive Committee shall review the standing of any member who is not able to fulfill meeting requirements.
- Section 4: The Executive Committee shall approve the budget.
- Section 5: Executive Committee members present shall constitute a quorum.

Article VIII Committees

Section 1: The President shall appoint the following standing committees:

<u>Activity and Service</u>: This committee shall present in May the annual awards for the Kitty Sparrow Activity Trophy, the Virginia Hodnett Spirit Award, The Helen Coddington Stanley Novice Award, Katherine Turner Horticulture Award, Sally Clark Artistic Award, and the 25 Year Service Award. (5/08) (9/16) (9/22)

<u>Admissions:</u> This committee shall present names of nominees for admission to the club and conduct the election. The chairman shall receive membership nominations 1 week prior to the October, November, March and April meetings.

<u>Civic Beautification</u>: This committee shall plan outside beautification work. They shall encourage planting of trees and flowers throughout the city and county.

Collections:

<u>Daffodil</u>: This chairman shall interest herself in daffodil culture and the daffodil flower show. She shall oversee the daffodil collection. She will cooperate with the Flower Show Chairman to prepare exhibits for flower shows.

<u>Rose:</u> This chairman shall interest herself in rose culture and the rose flower show. She shall oversee the rose collection. She will cooperate with the Flower Show Chairman to prepare exhibits for flower shows.

<u>Lily:</u> This chairman shall interest herself in lily culture and the lily flower show. She shall oversee the lily collection. She will cooperate with the Flower Show Chairman to prepare exhibits for flower shows.

<u>Communications</u>: This committee oversees all communications with club members. In addition, the Communications chair is responsible for maintaining all Garden Study Clun member date in the Garden Club of Virginia database as we as reporting out important GCV information as it relates to the club. (09/19) (9/22)

<u>Conservation</u>: This committee shall keep the club informed on conservation matters and encourage conservation measures within the membership and throughout the city and county. The chairman shall serve as the Bee City representative and on the program committee. (5/10) (9/22)

<u>Constitution and By-Laws</u>: The chairman of this committee shall be the Second Vice-President. If there is no second Vice-President, the President shall appoint a chairman. This committee shall review the Constitution and By-Laws as necessary and make recommendations to the Executive Committee. They shall provide updated material to the Yearbook Committee for distribution to members. (09/19)

<u>Horticulture</u>: This committee shall keep members advised on all matters pertaining to horticulture. They shall also prepare the horticulture Exhibits for the annual Meetings of The Garden Club of Virginia and the Board of Governors Meetings. The chairman shall serve on the program committee. (5/10)

<u>Hospitality Committee</u>: This committee shall be responsible for social functions of the club. The treasurer shall serve on this committee. (5/10)

Long Range Planning: This committee will assist the Executive Committee as needed. Members will be active past presidents of the GSC. (5/10)

Nominating: This committee shall present a slate of officers at the March business meeting.

<u>Photography:</u> This committee will ensure we have members pictures for the yearbook and GCV website. They shall also be responsible for taking photos at meetings and GSC events. (9/22)

<u>Program</u>: This committee shall plan the programs of the club. There shall be no program scheduled for the business meetings.

<u>Public Relations</u>: The committee shall be in charge of all publicity for the club including submission of articles to the GCV journal as well as social media postings press releases, and other public relations efforts. (9/16) (9/22)

<u>Teams and Exhibits:</u> This committee shall be in charge of judging artistic arrangements, horticulture exhibits and specimen at each meeting. The chairman will keep accurate records and strongly encourage each member to bring exhibits to meetings. (09/16) (09/19) (9/22)

<u>Ways and Means</u>: The First Vice-President shall serve as the chairman. The committee shall research ideas to raise funds to support the club's projects. (09/19).

<u>Yearbook:</u> This committee shall be in charge of scheduling hostesses, printing and distributing the yearbook, and distributing any yearbook updates.

Duties and Responsibilities of Head Hostess and Committee for monthly meeting

- 1. The first name on the hostess list is the head hostess
- 2. The invitation to the meeting will be sent to her from the first VP
- 3. She will review the information to be sure it is correct and notify the Communications chair 14 days before the meeting to email the invitation to all the members who have email. The members will respond will attend or not attend to THE HEAD HOSTESS email address. You and your committee will contact by phone those members not having an email address. This includes Sustainers. (If it is first meeting ask member if they do not wish to be called again) If you have not heard from a member a follow-up call should be made.
- 4. Reservations must be received 7 days prior to the meeting. Cancellations must also be made 7 days prior to meeting. You will then notify the appropriate contact person at the location with the number of members attending the Friday before meeting.
- 5. The head hostess will have already contacted the food preparer of your luncheon selection.
- 6. The invitation should include: location, time, artistic and horticulture arrangements, and program description (when appropriate) and email address of head hostess.
- 7. Notification that member is responsible for payment if not canceled in appropriate time should also be on invitation.
- 8. The head hostess will keep a list of those attending the luncheon and use it as a check off at the luncheon site. She should be at the entrance of the luncheon location. No shows names will be given to the treasurer for notification and billing. You will also pass along your list of attendees to the Corresponding Secretary.
