

## 43 QUEENS COURT




## 70 SETTLERS ROAD

The outdoor space and back patio read as a living canvas. Bright and inviting, it is flooded with warm sunlight that pours in from morning through afternoon. The yard is colorful and constantly evolving with the season, creating a cheerful, everyday connection between indoor life and outdoors. Planters and garden beds surround the patio, overflowing with seasonal blooms from spring bulbs to flowering shrubs and summer perennials.
